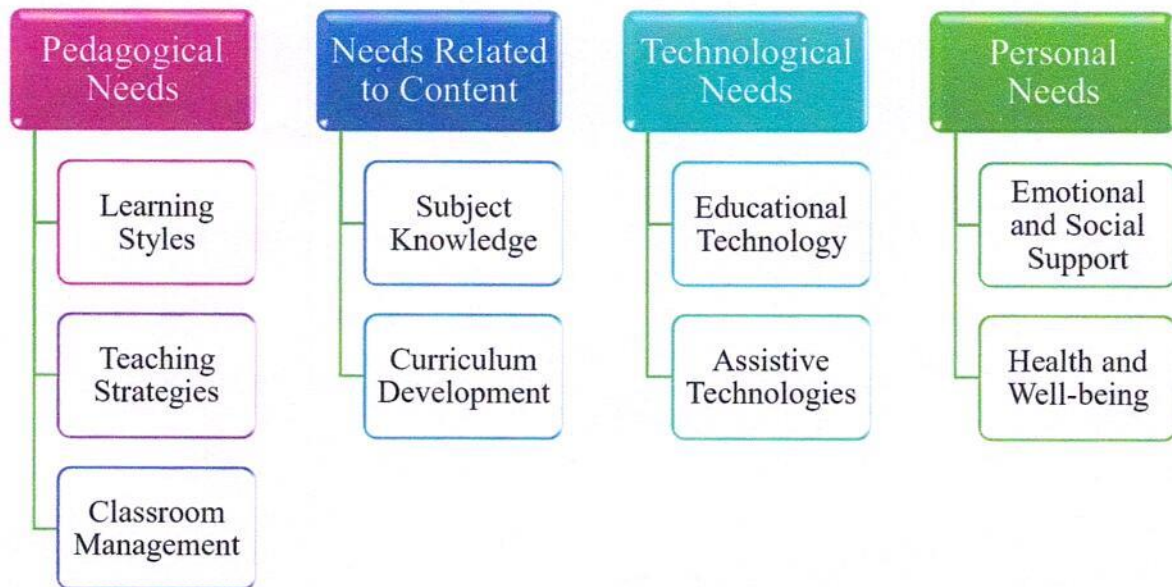

2.2.3. Report of activities to address the differential student needs

- Activity: Provide access to counseling services and peer support groups where trainees can discuss personal challenges and seek guidance.

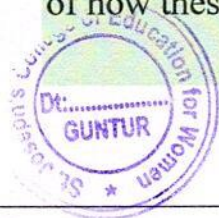
- Objective: Offer emotional support and resources to handle personal issues affecting their training.
