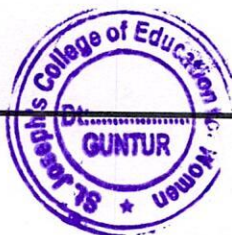
## **Report on Institutional Linkages with Schools and other Educational agencies for both academic and outreach activities**

### **1. Local Community based activities**

St. Joseph's College of Education for Women Guntur conducts several outreach activities in the college to sensitize students to social issues and community development. Student teachers are provided with ample opportunities to participate fully in the outreach and local community based activities. Our institution always stands ahead in transmitting Indian culture by celebrating all National events and festivals. In addition to regular national festivals, Communal Harmony week was observed and students from local colleges of education were invited and different activities and competitions in singing, dance, drama, painting, creative writing, Elocution and essay writing are conducted. Visits to slums help our students understand their culture, habits and style of living.

We also observe Women's Day and all religious feasts. These programmes were conducted in collaboration with NGOs like Jeevan Sadan, St. Ann's Manovikas, JMJ, and JMJ Social Service Organisation. The outreach programmes include the following:

- i. Celebrating all National events and festivals in transmitting Indian culture.
- ii. Observing Communal Harmony week for the students from local colleges of education and conducting different activities and competitions in singing, dance, drama, painting, creative writing, Elocution and essay writing.
- iii. Visits to slums help our students understand their culture, habits and style of living.
- iv. Activities focusing on yoga, physical exercise, and meditation are conducted for mental health
- v. Under social activities the college organizes programs like "Tree Plantation, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Blood Donation Camp"



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## 2. Teaching Practice and Internship in Schools

Students are oriented to take internship program seriously in the entire period. They would be instructed to prepare lesson plans beforehand, prepare required TLM and necessary things. The students are demonstrated to use different strategies and techniques and evaluation tools. Practicing innovative models, strategies and approaches under simulation sessions are implemented during internship. Methodology lecturers visit the schools during the program and monitor their work and give required suggestions. In each session internship would be for four weeks and the students become a part of the school. During the program, the students would participate in morning assembly, classes, games and all other activities in the school. Few school related activities for the activity record would also be completed in that period. Before the student teachers leave, they are oriented and instructed to observe code of conduct, dress code and take up the work assigned to them. Prior to M.Ed. internship orientation is given for phase I in II semester and phase II in third semester the phase I Internship has two aspects.

## 3. Organizes events of mutual interest- literary, cultural and open discussions on pertinent themes to school education

College organizes activities in collaboration with other schools and colleges of Education. It is our regular practice to organize literary events like essay writing, elocution and quiz competitions with neighboring colleges like RVRR college of Education, Guntur, AL College of Education, Hindu College of Education, JKC College, AC college, St. Joseph's Junior college. Our students participated in Completions and cultural programmes in other colleges.

## 4. Discern Ways to strengthen School Based Activities

Our student teachers conduct action research in the schools during internship to solve the problems of the classroom and hence to strengthen the teaching learning process. Our students regularly provide digital training to school children. Teachers from various schools collaborated to mentor students before their internship of Semester Two. This being the first internship experience of the students the session was very useful to help students understand how to plan and prepare for internship lessons. The students also interacted with the school teachers and had discussions regarding different challenges faced in teaching. The expertise and experience of the school teachers was duly leveraged to provide insights to the B.Ed students who were embarking on an important phase in their training.



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## 5. Join hands with schools in identifying areas for innovative practice

St. Joseph's college of Education always strives for the cause of education and for wholesome development of the personality of each child. During the Internship period our faculty regularly supervise the student teachers, interacts with the heads and teachers to join hands in identifying areas for innovative practice. We encourage our students to make use of technology and latest methods for teaching.

## 6. Rehabilitation Clinics

It gives us immense pleasure to extend helping hand with some rehabilitation clinics such as St. Ann's Manovikas, Jeevan Sadan, Manssanthi Counselling Centre, Global Counselling Psychologists Association, Jesus, Mary Joseph Social Service Society, Spandana Eda International Foundation. St. Joseph's College of Education for Women regularly conducts awareness programmes, counselling programmes in collaboration with these clinics.

## 7. Linkages with General Colleges

Our students regularly visit the local Junior and Degree colleges at the occasions of Inter Collegiate competitions, attending seminars and workshops etc. Every year we conduct inter collegiate competitions in which students of A.C. College, JKC College, Local Colleges of Education participated. Our students visited AC College on 19-06-2023 and had the opportunity of interacting with the staff and listening to their orientation.



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## Local Community Based Activities

Student teachers are provided with ample opportunities to participate fully in the outreach activities. Our institution always stands ahead in transmitting Indian culture by celebrating all National events and festivals. In addition to regular national festivals, Communal Harmony week was observed on 24<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> November 2022 and students from local colleges of education were invited and different activities and competitions in singing, dance, drama, painting, creative writing, Elocution and essay writing are conducted. Visits to slums help our students understand their culture, habits and style of living... We also observe Women's Day, Mother's Day and all religious feasts.

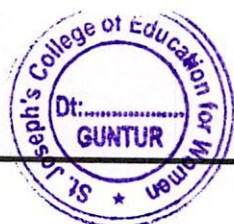
As a part of the outreach activities, the students made a visit to the ManoVikasKendra a school for mentally retarded children, and observed their psychological functions and behavior. The students also observed the services rendered by the nuns to those children with special needs. They visited Nirmal Hruday – an old age home run by the nuns, and observed the old people and also entertained them sportively. Solidarity day was observed to raise funds to help the poor and needy. Several games were conducted for the students with a nominal fee and food courts were organized by the students from where everybody bought food items. The money collected through all these activities was sent to an orphanage. Clothes, food and some accessories had been distributed among the poor, and some mentally retarded children, and the sick were given fruits.



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## Swachh Bharat Abhiyan

Swachh Bharat programme was organized at St. Joseph's College of Education from 13.04.2023 to 15.04.2023 as a part of Clean and Green Environmental Initiatives. Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) or Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA) or Clean India Mission is a country-wide campaign initiated by the Government of India. As a part of the programme, students and staff recited the Swachh pledge. The students also took up the initiative of cleaning the campus, classrooms, hostel etc. Our students served as "Ambassadors of cleanliness" "not only taking part in the cleanliness of the Institution but also carrying the message wherever they go. Students took the initiative of cleaning the campus and making it look greener. 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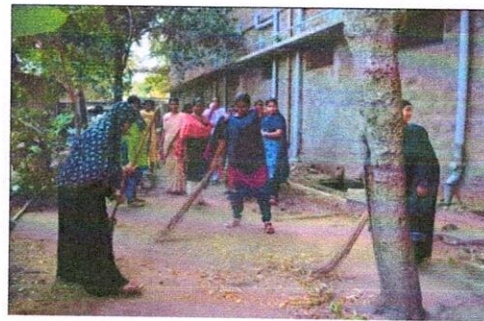

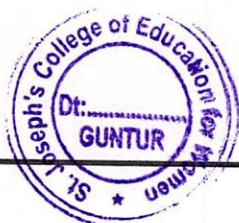

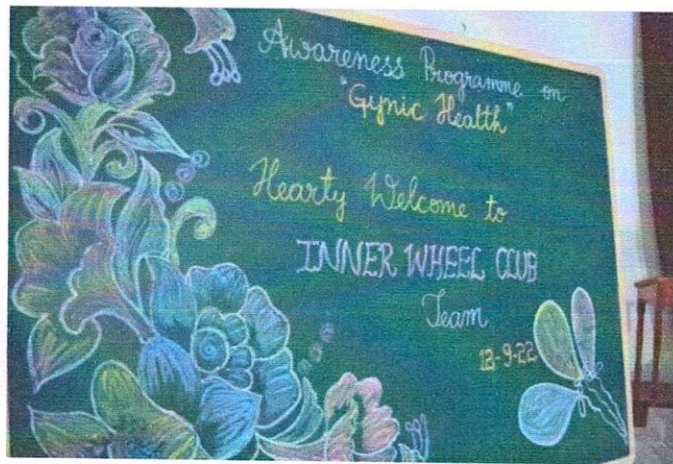
Sr.Gloria explaining the causes and the prevention mechanism of HIV/AIDS in a seminar held on 1/12/2022 (World Aids Day).

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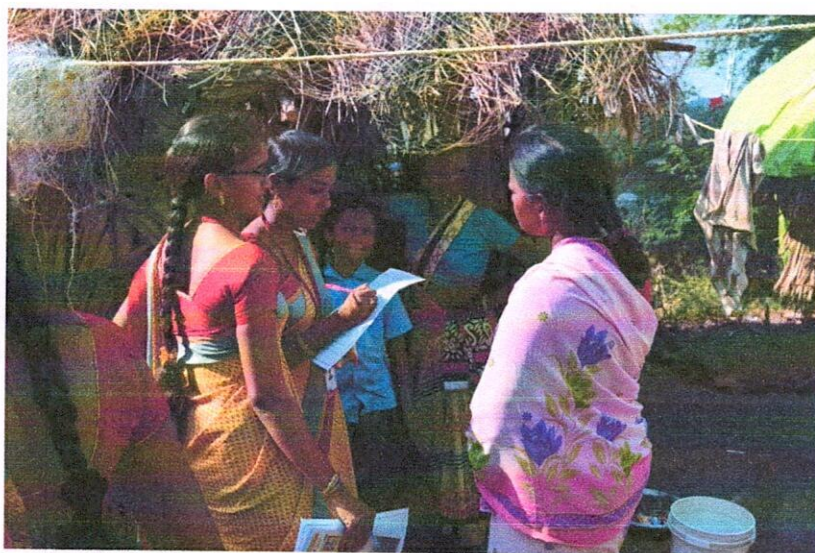
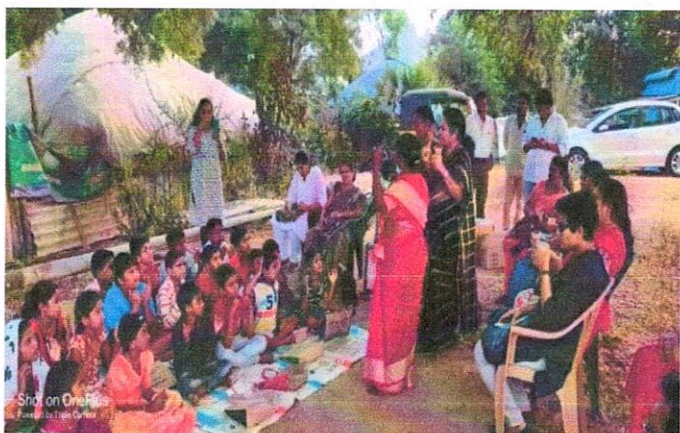
## Vana Mahothsavam

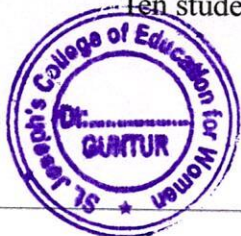
Seven student teachers, primarily hostel residents, were assigned to Government Boys High School due to its proximity and accommodating environment.

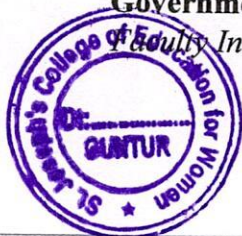
Eight Telugu medium student teachers were assigned to this school.

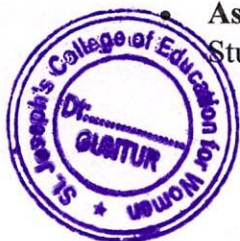
### 1. SJRR MC High School, Kothapeta, Guntur

- **Participation in PTA:** Students attended parent-teacher association meetings as silent participants, gaining exposure to parent-teacher interactions.

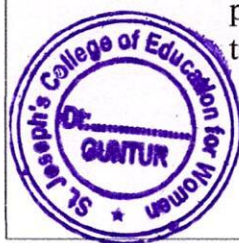

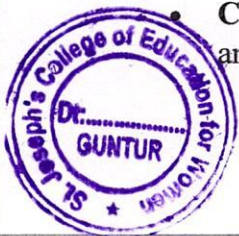
The following schools were selected for the internship program. Each institution provided a unique learning environment that contributed to the holistic development of our student teachers.

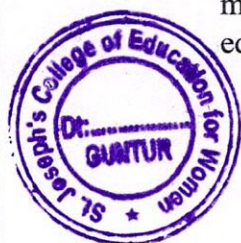

After completing their micro teaching practice and the practice teaching of three lessons in the college under the supervision of their lecturers, student teachers proceed to their respective schools for the internship. During the third semester, they are required to teach 17 lessons, followed by an additional 3 plus 17 lessons in the fourth semester. The mentors assist the students in planning their schedules and teaching strategies.

**Classroom Teaching:** Planning for teaching involves incorporating a variety of activities to engage students. Student teachers employ creative and innovative techniques, paired with a friendly approach, to make their lessons both interesting and lively. Each child in the class is given the opportunity to participate, enjoying the diverse methods introduced by the student teachers. In the second semester, the student teachers observe the regular teachers in the classroom, gaining insights into real-world teaching dynamics. In the third semester, as the student teachers lead their lessons, the school teachers closely observe and provide detailed feedback both orally and in written reports, highlighting strengths and pinpointing areas for improvement. Daily reflective journal sessions allow the student teachers to introspect and identify their strengths and weaknesses, helping them to rectify their mistakes.

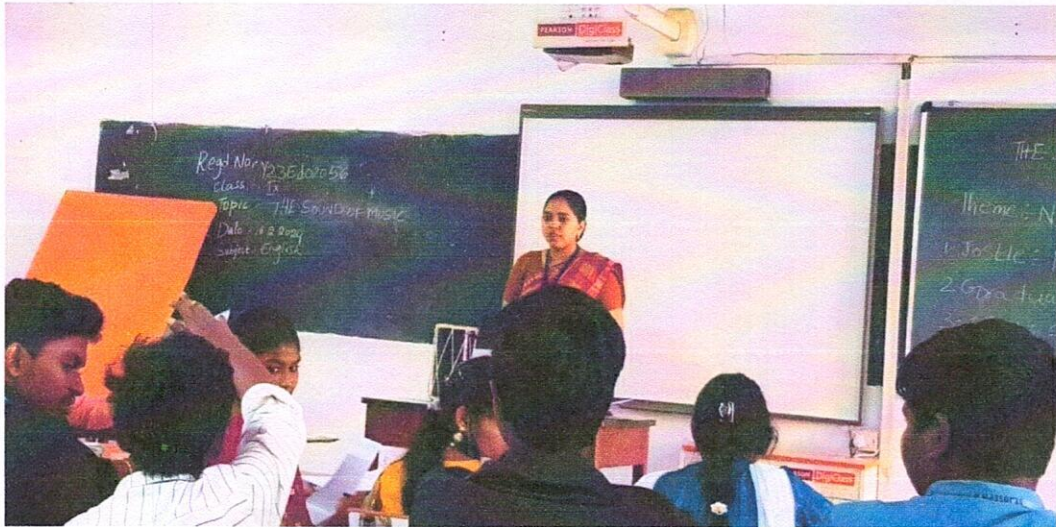

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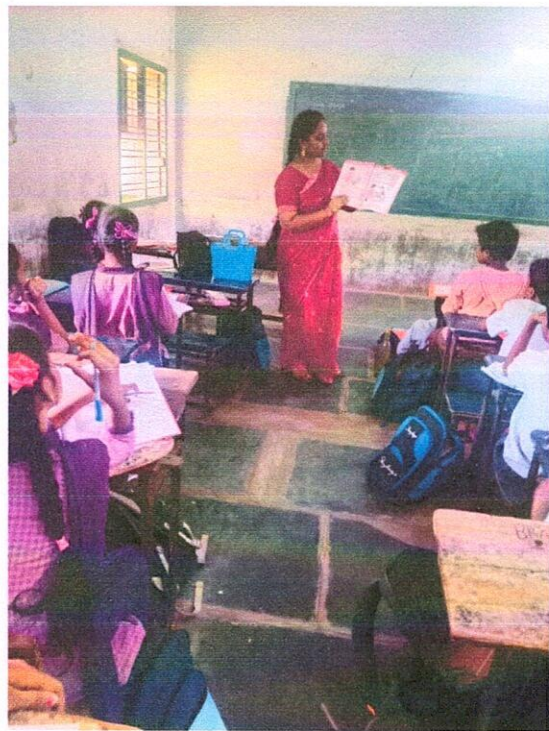

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## **Organizes events of mutual interest- literary, cultural and open discussions on pertinent themes to school education**

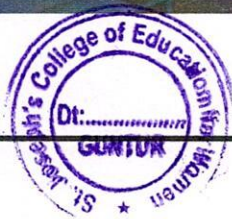

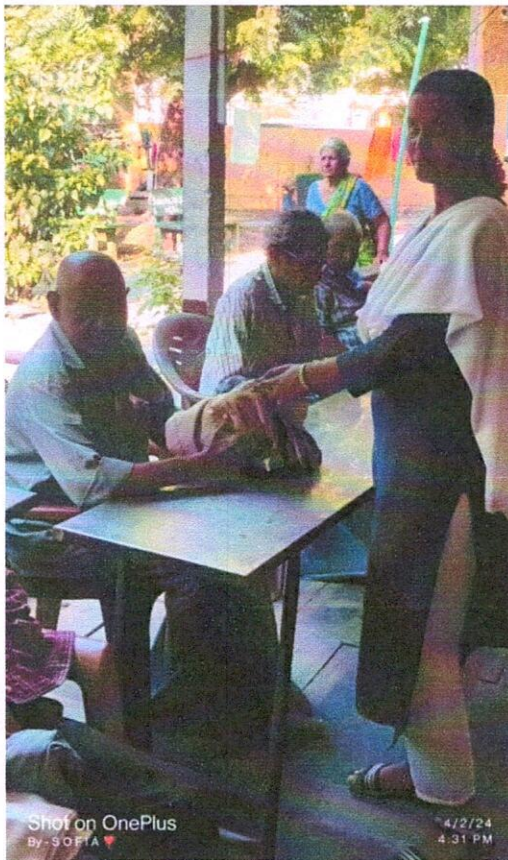


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## Visit to Orphanages, Old age homes
